Fire Service Visit Year 1 & Year 5



On Wednesday 24th January, the Cheetahs (Y1) and Pumas (Y5) had a visit from Clive, a community fire officer.

The Pumas found out how quickly a room can be consumed by fire and also learnt about the dangers of arson. The children also learnt about the severity of making hoax emergency calls, how to make a fire escape plan for our house and where to place smoke alarms.

The Cheetahs learnt about fire safety and how dangerous lighters and matches can be. They watched 'Francis the Firefly' and learnt that matches are not toys. The children all practised 'Stop, Drop and Roll'.

They also practised how to get out a room if it was on fire. They had to crawl out and shut the door & learnt never to go back into a burning building.
