


WONDERFUL WORK YEAR 3

Last week year 3 wrote up their Play Script into their publishing book. This child was trying super hard with to remember capital letters, colons and to use cursive writing.






For our RE we have been learning about Holy Week and the importance of Easter in the Christian calendar. The class have sequenced the events of Holy Week and wrote a short description for each picture.
