
ATTENDANCE

They are common and can be found in most hot countries. These creatures are mostly d in countries such as Australia and Tasmania. This Scorpion has many fascinating features, similar to the common Scorpion

Appearance!

The fascinating creature has 25mm rough shell on its back which is a Creamy, pastel yellow colour to camouflage in with its surroundings. Interestingly, its wide eyes lure creatures towards them and then, they pounce at their prey and sting them with its poisonous pincer, This makes the prey lifeless and paralysed. Under the Wood- Scorpions 🌋 Abdomen is small, sharp claws, but only adults produce these. This means that they can climb and grab things easily. Amazingly, they are also born with a hard exoskeleton, this allows babies to survive long falls or any bad or lifeless injuries.

Habitat and Lifestyle!

This amazing creature has a very phenomenal habitat and various Spaces, throughout the forest. It will create burrows under big, slimy Leaves and also damp, dark trees.
