## ATTENDANCE



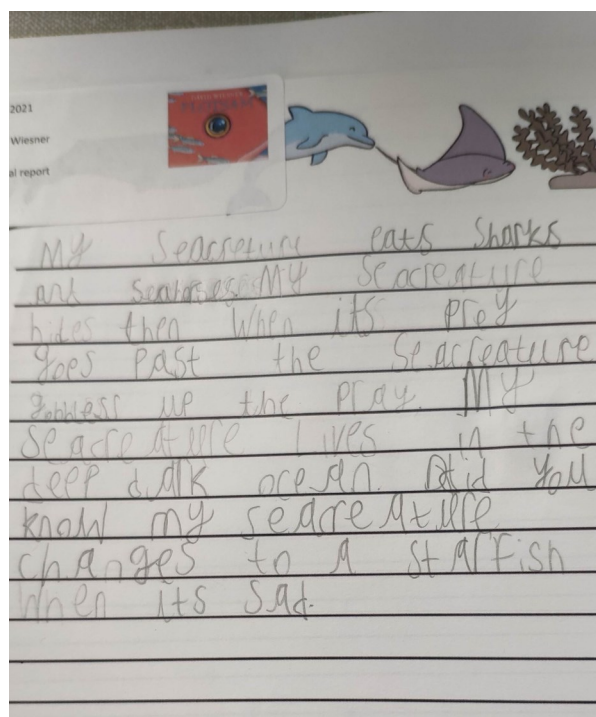

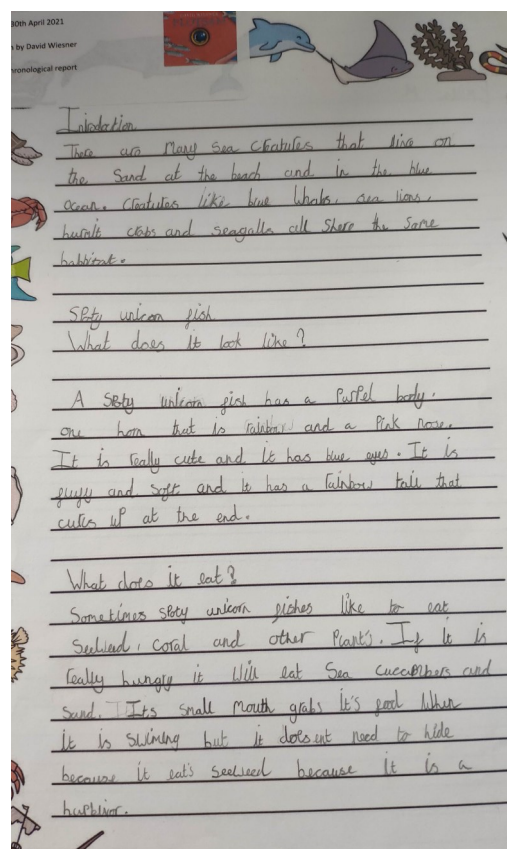


## WONDERFUL WORK YEAR 1 & 2



### Year 1

This work makes sense and flows well. The child has used 'fred talk' to hear all the sounds and used key spellings we talked about in class such as 'creature'. It has capital letters and full stops. They have used a simple 'and' conjunction to extend their sentence. They have also included some adjectives such as deep. Presentation is neat.



### Year 2

The non-chronological report has a title and is split into paragraphs with subtitles. They have used punctuation including commas in a list and question marks. They are starting to choose some relevant vocabulary, like habitat. They have extended their sentences using a variety of conjunctions, including that, if, because and when. Presentation is joined and neat.

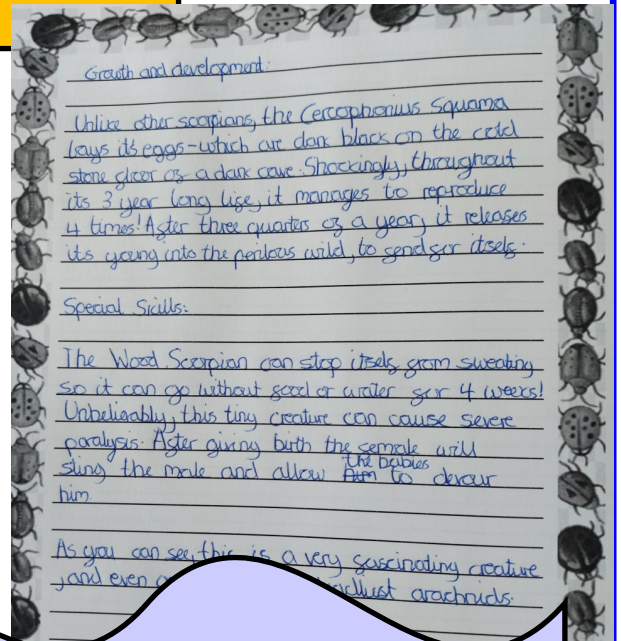
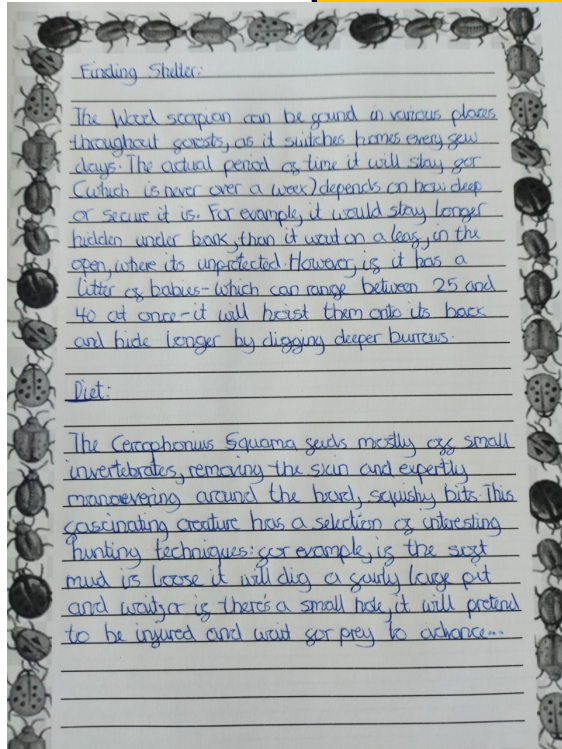

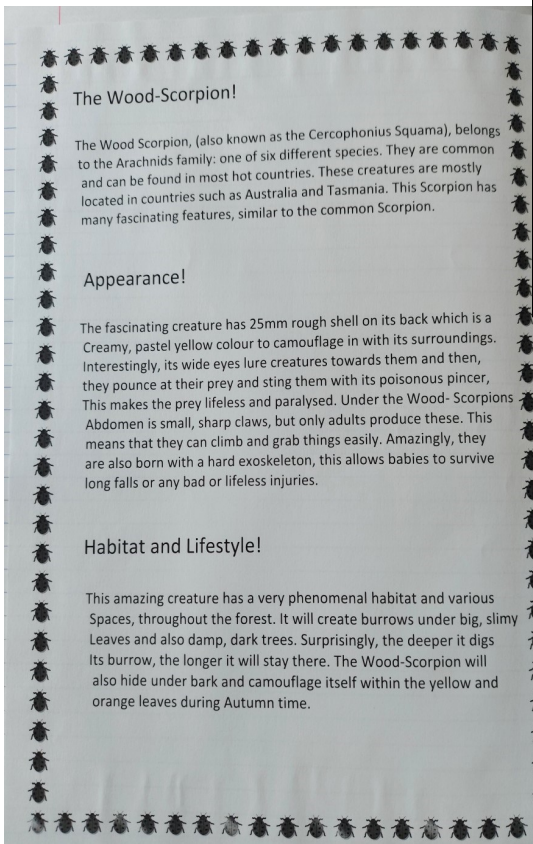


## Wonderful work Year 6
