Teachers have been supported with detailed plans and staff training delivered to facilitate high quality further weekly class PE lessons.</p> <p>The sports coach has maintained a high focus for PE by sharing news frequently during whole school and family Friday assemblies. SEND and reluctant pupils were encouraged and there was high uptake of inclusive sport events.</p> <p>The school successfully engaged with “Beat the Street” with high uptake across year groups. Staff included daily school walks into the programme.</p> <p>The school was successful in achieving 2 awards from LSLSSP in recognition of the work this year in improving engagement.</p>	£1000
