Monday	Please complete the SPaG mat <i>Take it further: Can you make a list of some other words that end in 'er' or 'est' ?</i>
Tuesday	Complete the common exception word mat <i>Take it further: Can you write some of your own sentences using the word 'are'?</i>
Wednesday	Complete the spelling sheet using your best cursive handwriting. <i>Take it further: Can you do a look/cover/check and maybe a mini spelling test?</i>
Thursday	Use the pictures on the sheet (I can use commas in a list) to write sentences and use a comma to separate each adjective. Remember to use a capital letter and full stop. <i>Take it further: Could you write your own sentence about one of your toy using commas?</i>
Friday	Use the story setting sheet to write a paragraph. Use your skills from this week. Remember to describe using adjectives with a comma in between. Use your senses to help you – what could you hear, smell, see, taste, feel. <i>Take it further: Edit your own work with another colour pen/pencil and check for missing punctuation or incorrect spellings.</i>

Maths

Monday	Use the ladybird sheet – halving to 20. Share the dots out equally between each half of the ladybird. <i>Take it further: Can you investigate – Can all numbers to 20 be halved equally?</i>
Tuesday	Complete the feeding owlets sheet. Remember to share the mice equally. <i>Take it further: Could you use small objects at home to practise sharing out in equally? Pick different numbers to see if they can be shared equally between 2, 3, 4 or 5. What do you find out?</i>
Wednesday	Complete the division by sharing sheet. <i>Take it further: What do you notice about sharing odd and even amounts?</i>
Thursday	Sweetie share. You could use real sweets or food to do this activity practically.
