
A final plea from me, it is our school meal census day on Thursday 6th Oct so please can <u>all</u> children have a school lunch on that day—it does really help us financially.

The other activity was 'Bridge-Building' which everyone, adults and children, enjoyed. Each group were given a certain number of logs, some rope and a stream to cross! In Jellyfish, it is worth mentioning Joshua Wright and his kindness in lending his wellies to everyone in the class so that trainers were not ruined!
