
Dear Parents

PLEASE READ.

We have been advised by our Attendance Officer of changes to attendance following new guidance from the DFE. We will be amending our attendance policy to reflect this and this will then be ratified by our school governors. In future all holiday requests of over 5 days will incur a fine irrespective of the child's attendance prior to the request. If a child is off for more than five day s with an illness medical evidence will be required. This may seem harsh but as we have already said there is a high expectation on attendance this year from ourselves as well as the DFE and we are expected to follow guidelines.
