For St Peter's Church of England Primary School Whetstone the school code is LE146603 and visit www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk or scan the QR code using your smartphone camera to go straight to the website③ Select Seasonal Flu and enter the school code. On the consent declaration page you can consent for either the nasal flu vaccine or the injectable flu vaccine.② You will receive a confirmation email when the form is submitted


## Mrs Howard's Books of the Week

Excellent work everyone!


Quotes from the children:
